A: Snow.

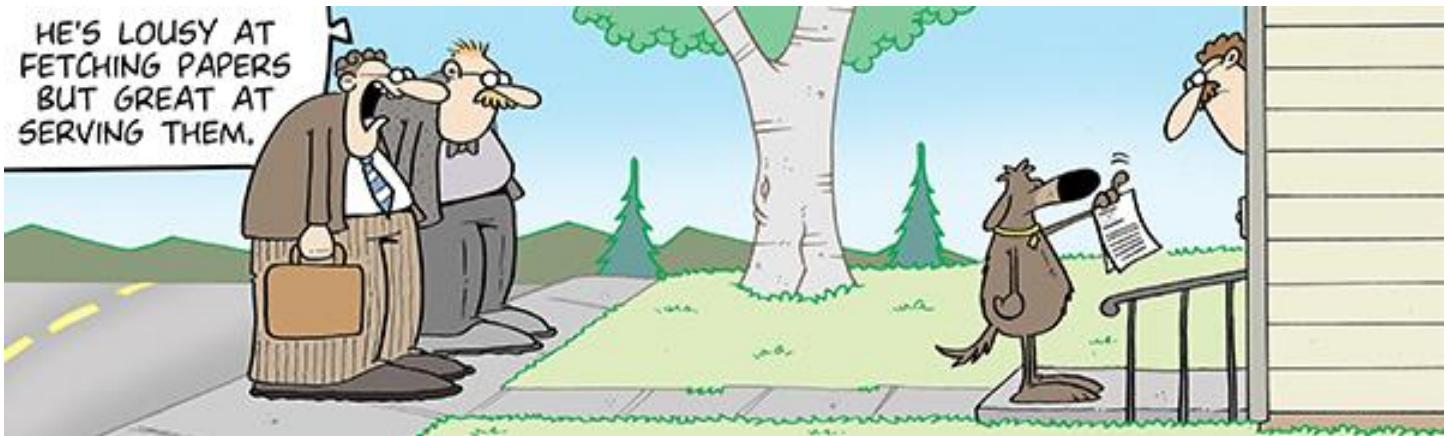
I'm on a seafood diet.
