Hawk was charged with disorderly intoxication.

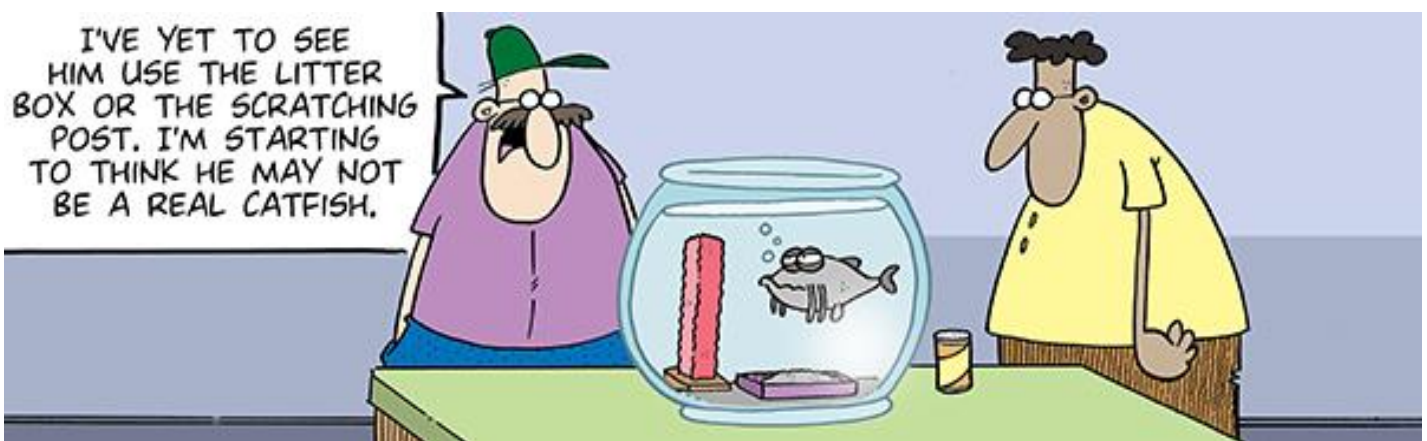
