**Program:** The October program will be about the North Valley Community Foundation (NVCF). From 2005 when Alexa Benson-Valavanis was hired and began with an initial budget of only \$35,000, she quickly began a rebuilding effort and NVCF went from serving a dozen clients to hundreds of clients within the first few years of the rebuild. Assets grew from a little over \$1 million to more than \$60 million and grants awarded increased from thousands of dollars to millions of dollars to our communities. The NVCF administers and funds scholarships, social justice initiatives, Glenn County drought relief, and numerous grants including the <u>Aaron Rodgers NorCal Fire Recovery Fund.</u>

**David Little**, who will be our speaker, is the Executive Vice President, Communications for NVCF. David has 40 years of experience as a journalist, including nearly 20 as Editor of the Chico Enterprise-Record. He is a Chico native and Chico State University graduate. He plays a major role in the relief and recovery strategy and relays stories about the Foundation

On **October 26, 1972,** Edwin Land introduced and sold the first truly instant color camera, **the Polaroid SX-70 camera,** at an event in Miami, Florida and began selling it nationally in fall 1973. Polaroid founder Edwin Land actually announced the SX-70 at a company annual meeting in April 1972. On stage, he took out a folded SX-70 from his suit coat pocket and in ten seconds took five pictures, both actions impossible with previous Land Cameras. In 1948, Polaroid introduced its first consumer camera. The <u>Land Camera Model 95</u> was the first camera to use instant film to quickly produce photographs without developing them in a laboratory. The popular Model 95 and subsequent Land Cameras required complex procedures to take and produce good photographs. Photographic paper had to be manually removed from cameras, peeled open after 60 seconds, needed several minutes to dry, and often left developing chemicals on hands. Pictures from the SX-70, by contrast, ejected automatically and developed quickly (fully within 10 minutes) without chemical residue.
