Technology Information

Brave Internet Browser

Do you watch some videos on your browser or from YouTube that is always breaking in with ads? I used to. It got very frustrating having these 15 or 30 second ads pop up right in the middle of these videos.

Well, there is a solution. I installed the "Brave" internet browser onto my pc. It is an internet browser that is built on the Google Chromium open-source project. It is very familiar with Chrome. Easy to use!

Now, when I am browsing with Chrome, Microsoft Edge or YouTube and see a video I want to view, I just click on the video and then highlight the address in the address bar, press a CTRL + C (copy), open the "Brave" browser, click in the Brave address bar and press CTRL + V (paste) and hit the enter button. Wa La! I can watch the video without the frustrating ads.

The Brave internet browser is a free web browser that is heavily focused on user privacy, speed, and security. It was co-founded in 2015 by Brendan Eich, the creator of JavaScript and co-founder of the Mozilla project.

Key aspects and features of the Brave browser are built-in Ad and Tracker Blocking (Brave Shields). Unlike other browsers, Brave blocks third-party ads, trackers, and cross-site cookies automatically on every website, including video and streaming sites like YouTube. This results in faster loading times and a cleaner browsing experience.


