The program, "Lumber Town," will look at those processes and jobs used by the Red River Lumber Company in its Westwood operations



from 1912 to 1944. The program also will examine briefly recent changes in the industry, including new equipment and the impacts of wildfires.

The speaker will be a Branch 110 member-**Bill Niepoth.** Bill's logging background is based on his father and grandfather's experiences in the woods at a wide variety of jobs. Bill also had summer logging jobs in the Westwood area while attending Chico State and before obtaining his doctorate from Stanford University and well before being inducted into the Chico State Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004 for his track performance.
