50 Years Ago December 29, 1972:

Life magazine's <u>final weekly issue</u> carried the December 29, 1972, date, though it was on newsstands the week before. *Life* was an American magazine published weekly from 1883 to 1972, as an intermittent "special" until 1978, and as a monthly from 1978 until 2000. During its golden age from 1936 to 1972, *Life* was a wide-ranging weekly general-interest magazine known for the quality of its photography, and was one of the most popular magazines in the nation, regularly reaching one-quarter of the population.
