The price was \$3.2 million more than the price paid by CBS for the team in 1965. In 2013 the value was \$2.3 billion. By 2022 the value was \$6 billion.

Persistence and Determination IV

Hans Augusto Reyersbach was born on September 16, 1898, in <u>Hamburg</u>, Germany. His early childhood revealed his early talent for drawing. In his neighborhood was a zoo, which gave him a familiarity with nonfarm animals. He often drew in school instead of doing his schoolwork.

Margarete Elisabeth Waldstein was born on May 16, 1906, also in <u>Hamburg</u>. She studied art between 1926 and 1928 and afterward worked in advertising. Hans and Margarete were German Jews. The couple first met in Hamburg at Margarete's sister's 16th birthday party.

In 1924, at the age of 26, when in the harsh aftermath of World War I, there was little employment at home, Hans left to find work in Brazil. Hans always carried his sketchbook with him.

With financial matters having gone from bad to worse, he accepted a job in a firm in Brazil. He thus found himself composing commercial letters (which he was not allowed to adorn with illustrations) and selling bathtubs up and down the Amazon River. Obviously it was not the right road but it took him years to find that out.

In 1935, Margarete Waldstein also traveled to South America and, on arrival in Rio de Janeiro, looked up her Hamburg acquaintance. Their courtship was a rapid one, and in August 1935 they wed.

Restless and ambitious, Margarete persuaded Hans to give up his work in import-export and join her in an advertising venture. They wrote newspaper articles and advertisements, did posters, photography— anything that came their way. Hans described it as a "Turning Point" in his life.

Intending to spend a brief honeymoon period in Paris they returned "home". However, they stayed for four years as Brazilian citizens and with Brazilian passports. Margarete took photographs and he drew. While in Paris, Hans's animal drawings came to the attention of a French publisher, who commissioned him to write a children's book about animals. The result is little remembered today, but they decided to write another book about just one of its characters. Their work was interrupted with the outbreak of <u>World War II</u>. As Jews, they decided to flee from Paris before the Nazis seized the city. The trains were full or canceled. They owned no car. So Hans built two bicycles. In June 1940, on a rainy morning before dawn, a few hours before the Nazis entered, they left Paris on bicycles with nothing but warm coats and their manuscripts they were working on, and could not bear to jettison and started pedaling south.

They finally made it to Lisbon, by train, having sold their bicycles to custom officials at the French-Spanish border. They returned to Brazil. After a brief interlude in Rio de Janeiro, their migrations came to an end on one clear, crisp October morning in 1940, when they saw the Statue of Liberty rise above the harbor of New York and landed in the U.S.A.

In 1935, for the convenience of clients, and as a way to forge a shared commercial identity, the couple had renamed themselves **H. A. and Margret Rey**. Finally in 1941, the first of the books with Rey's name was published by Houghton Mifflin.

Perhaps by this time you may have guessed that these two were the creators of character a called......

Curious George was an instant success, and the Reys were commissioned to write more adventures of the mischievous monkey and his friend, the Man in the Yellow Hat. They wrote seven stories in all, with Hans mainly doing the illustrations and Margret working mostly on the stories, though they both admitted to sharing the work and cooperating fully in every stage of development. George became an industry with more than 27 million copies sold. There have been several "Curious George" films produced and of course the sales of the ubiquitous toy figure.


