A Story About a Song

Sanford (Sandy) Greenberg, was attending Columbia University in 1958 and was rooming with a guy named Arthur. In 1961, in his junior year, Sandy lost his sight completely, became depressed, dropped out of school and returned home.

Arthur, however, visited him and encouraged him to return to school. He said "the darkness will accompany you but I will be your light." He started to do everything for his roommate. He read his books for him, read his exams and guided him around campus. He even adopted the moniker "Darkness" as a mark of empathy, when he was with his troubled friend. Arthur would refer to himself as "Darkness" whenever he would announce his arrival: "Sanford, Darkness is here to read for you" he would say.

Sandy graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Columbia in 1961. Despite being totally blind, he earned two graduate degrees from Harvard and went on to have a very successful career. In 2020 he wrote his memoir and titled it "*Hello Darkness my old Friend"*.

But what about a story about a song? In 1964 Sandy's old roommate, Arthur, called and ask if he could borrow \$400 in order to pay for making a recording of a song.

Despite not having much more than \$400 at that time, Sandy gladly loaned Arthur the money.

The song was recorded and released in 1964 and became one of the most listened to songs of the century. It has been rightfully heralded as one of the greatest folk songs ever written.

It was recorded by Simon and Garfunkel with the title of "*Sound of Silence*" and has the opening line "Hello Darkness my old friend". Perhaps you have figured out that Sandy's roommate (Arthur) was in fact Art Garfunkel. Now you know the rest of the story.


