LOGISTICS: At Riverbend Park, we'll meet at the trailhead just past the restrooms. Restrooms along the route are in the parking area at Riverbend Park plus restrooms are close to part of the route as we walk near downtown. Bring water. Bring a snack, if desired.

Suggest bringing sunscreen, lip balm, walking poles or staff if desired, a personal first aid kit and rain gear. This is a bird area so binoculars could come in handy. Include in your pack the name of an emergency contact and contact information and medical insurance information.

Bring money for lunch afterward. Lunch will be at Tong Fong Low, Oroville (optional)

COMMENTS: This hike is generally on even terrain with minor elevation changes. Surfaces may be uneven so be alert to tripping and fall hazards. Much of the route is paved and we need to be aware of other trail users that may include joggers and cyclists. A small portion of the route is on grassy, uneven terrain and another portion may involve walking over rocks.

50 Years Ago February 3, 1973: In Fairfield, California, a trial judge sentenced serial killer Juan Corona (age 39) to 25 life sentences, one for each of the 25 men whom he had been convicted of murdering. Superior Judge Richard Patton added that the life sentences would "be served consecutively and not concurrently." Corona had been convicted of the crimes on January 18. Despite the sentence, California Adult Authority ruled that Corona would be eligible for parole after only seven years rather than 175 years (7 years for each of the 25 life sentences) and that the consecutive sentences would be merged to run concurrently citing section 669 of the penal code, which mandated that when a crime is punished by life imprisonment, with or without the possibility of parole, then all other convictions shall be merged and run concurrently. However, Corona spent the rest of his life in prison, dying at age 85.

February 12, 1973: Ohio became the first U.S. state to use the metric system, with an experiment to post distances on road signs on Interstate 71 in both miles and kilometers. The United States had seriously begun considering a conversion to the metric system in 1968 when Congress authorized the U.S. Metric Study, a three-year study of systems of measurement in the United States. A number of other plans followed including Congress passing the Metric Conversion Act of 1975 to coordinate and plan the increasing use of the metric system in the United States. However, the Department of Transportation plan to require metric units by 2000 was canceled by the 1998 highway bill TEA21. One lone complete adoption of the metric system in the country's vast network of highways still exists today. A 102 kilometer (63-mile) stretch of highway from Tucson, Arizona to Nogales near the Mexican border is the only metric highway in the United States. Known as Interstate 19, sign distances are provided in meters and kilometers instead of in miles.


