In her position, Sherry is tasked with obtaining the return of Commercial Service and bringing the airport into compliance with Federal, State and local rules and regulations and returning the airport to fiscal solvency.

She is responsible for all aspects of airport management and operations including safety and security, airfield and facility maintenance, and the safe and efficient operation of the airport. She also oversees the Airport's Capital Improvement Program including providing a revolving 20-year project listing. Before coming to Chico, Sherry was the Airport Director at Lake Tahoe Airport for eight years and managed eight airports for the County of San Diego Airports System for eight years. Sherry has a bachelor's degree in Aviation Management from southern Illinois University and a master's degree in Public Administration from National University. She is a private pilot with over 300 hours.

On <u>Thursday</u>, <u>March 5</u>, <u>1970</u>, the **Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty** went into effect after being ratified by 47 nations. Leaders of the three sponsoring nations — U.S. President Richard M. Nixon, Soviet Union Premier Alexei N. Kosygin, and United Kingdom Prime Minister Harold Wilson — signed instruments of ratification in their respective capitals, and leaders of five other nations executed similar documents Treaty members agreed that they would not share nuclear weapons, nor acquire such weapons in the future. Under the terms of the agreement, signed on July 1, 1968, the pact would go into

effect upon ratification by the three sponsors and by at least 40 other nations.

Opened for signature in 1968, the treaty entered into force in 1970. As required by the text, after twenty-five years, NPT Parties met in May 1995 and agreed to extend the treaty indefinitely. More countries have adhered to the NPT than any other arms limitation and disarmament agreement, a testament to the treaty's significance. As of August 2016, 191 states have adhered to the treaty, though North Korea, which acceded in 1985 but never came into compliance, announced its withdrawal from the NPT in 2003, following detonation of nuclear devices in violation of core obligations. Four UN member states have never accepted the NPT, three of which possess nuclear weapons: India, Israel, and Pakistan. In addition, South Sudan, founded in 2011, has not joined.


