His long journey as a coach stretches into the classroom with the students he teaches. Felipe focused in anthropology, sociology and identity cultural race theory for the PhD he received from Davis in 2014. He uses these badges mainly to assist students of color on campus. His specialties in these areas are a key to the soccer program's graduation success; he has helped 70 students graduate in his 10 years of coaching.

**LOGISTICS:** Bring water. Bring a snack, if desired. Suggest bringing sunscreen, lip balm, walking poles or staff if desired, a personal first aid kit, and a hat. This is a bird area so binoculars could come in handy. Include in your pack the name of an emergency contact and contact information and medical insurance information. Bring money for gathering for a drink afterward (optional).

**COMMENTS:** This hike is generally on uneven terrain with some elevation changes. Surfaces are uneven so be alert to tripping and fall hazards. We need to be aware of other trail users that may include joggers and cyclists. Temperatures are starting to climb so make sure to bring water.
