<p>Hiking</p>		<p>May 9: WALK ALONG OROVILLE'S FEATHER RIVER PARKWAY Our May walk is the outing we had originally scheduled for March. We're looking forward to better weather on Tuesday, May 9th than in March and the opportunity to enjoy this walk.</p>
<p>PLACE: Riverside Park, Oroville (meet at Chico Park and Ride lot off Highway 99 - the lot closest to 99) and proceed to Riverbend Park in Oroville. Lunch after at Tong Fong Low, Oroville (optional). DATE: Tuesday, May 9, 2023 TIME: 9:15 am WEAR: Layers, hat, walking or hiking shoes or boots LOGISTICS: At Riverbend Park, we'll meet at the trailhead just past the restrooms. Restrooms along the route are in the parking area at Riverbend Park plus restrooms are close to part of the route as we walk near downtown. Bring water. Bring a snack, if desired. Suggest bringing sunscreen, lip balm, walking poles or staff if desired, a personal first aid kit and rain gear. This is a bird area so binoculars could come in handy. Include in your pack the name of an emergency contact and contact information and medical insurance information. Bring money for lunch afterward. COMMENTS: This hike is generally on even terrain with minor elevation changes. Surfaces may be uneven so be alert to tripping and fall hazards. Much of the route is paved and we need to be aware of other trail users that may include joggers and cyclists. 


