

May 30 1971: *Mariner 9* was launched by the US towards Mars at 6:32 p.m. local time from Cape Kennedy, 11 days after the Soviet Union had launched *Mars 2*. On November 14, it became the first spacecraft from Earth to orbit another planet, when it reached Mars and took photographs. No attempt to land a probe was made. And here we are fifty years later with another Mars mission. The USA's Perseverance rover has successfully landed on Mars with a helicopter called Ingenuity strapped to its belly. NASA's **Mars helicopter** Ingenuity successfully flew for the first time in the thin air

above the red planet on April 19, 2021.


