50 Years Ago May 5, 1973: Secretariat won the Kentucky Derby.

On May 19, Secretariat won the Preakness Stakes, and after having won the Kentucky Derby two weeks earlier, it raised the possibility that he would become the first thoroughbred racehorse to win the Triple Crown of American horseracing.

On June 9, 1973, facing a field of five horses, <u>Secretariat</u> won the Belmont Stakes by 31 <u>lengths</u>. It occurred in front of a crowd of 69,138 spectators. This was the largest margin of victory in Belmont history. His winning time of 2 minutes and 24 seconds still stands as the American record for a mile and a half on dirt.

Music Notes

"Sweet Caroline" by Neil Diamond

The inspiration for Neil Diamond's 1969 hit single would remain a mystery for more than four decades. Only then would Diamond finally reveal that the eponymous Caroline was none other than the daughter of President John F. Kennedy. Neil had seen an issue of Life Magazine from September 7, 1962, featuring a four-year-old Caroline Kennedy riding a pony. The image brewed in the musician's fertile imagination for five years until he finally wrote the timeless song. Finally, when Neil Diamond was invited to perform for Caroline Kennedy's 50th birthday in 2007, he told everyone the story. In a 2011 television interview, he added details about the magazine cover. However, the story got a little more complicated in 2014 when Neil said that, in fact, the song was about his wife Marcia and that he changed the name in order to have the three syllables that he needed to fit the rhythm. We may never know the whole truth.

Not only has "Sweet Caroline" become one of Neil Diamond's biggest hits and most beloved songs but it has also been covered by other major recording artists, including Elvis Presley and Frank Sinatra.


