dogs assisting police in arresting criminals. Now you get a chance to meet two ex-Chico K-9 police officers who have one of the top K-9 dog training facilities located in Chico called Ridgeside K9 NorCal.

Rich Hartman (pictured on the right) is one of the trainers. He was born and raised in Chico and is a 25-year veteran of law enforcement. For 15 years Rich was a full-time K9 handler.

Brett Smith (pictured on the left) born and raised in Reno, moved

to Chico in 1990 where he was hired as a police officer for the Chico Police Department. Brett was the first K-9 officer on the Chico Police Department beginning in 1996.

They will explain how they train dogs, the best breeds to train, where the dogs come from and the different agencies that use them.

Note: Depending on the schedule, they plan to have a current Chico Police officer and his dog at our meeting. They are hoping to have the newest trained dog that just spent guite a bit of time in an East Coast tracking training.

Additional Thought: There is national talk about starting to train dogs to help stop shoplifting and theft, and also to be on school grounds for added safety. K-9 training may be in big demand and you're about to learn how the training is done.




