Program: Tracy Mohr, our Speaker for the June 26, 2023 Luncheon, has over 45 years of experience in animal care and control, starting as a volunteer at a local animal shelter while in high school. Though she had wanted to become a veterinarian, she decided that working on behalf of shelter animals would have a more beneficial impact.

Tracy's experiences include vet tech, animal control officer, and animal shelter manager. She has previously run the Butte Humane Society shelter as Executive Director and has worked for the City of Chico as an animal control officer. Tracy is also the founder of several non-profit organizations and has run a horse sanctuary



since 2001. Tracy has been the Animal Services Manager for the City of Chico since 2012, when the city resumed shelter operations as "Chico Animal Shelter." She moved the city to no-kill status in her first year. With limited staffing, Chico Animal Shelter has been able to drastically reduce the euthanasia rate, support atrisk animals, and provide programs that serve as a model for shelters across America and overseas.

JUNE 13: UPPER BIDWELL HIKE

Our June 13 hike is a return to Upper Bidwell. Time change: We'll meet at **8:30 am** at Horseshoe Lake. We're thinking a hike out along Middle Bidwell and a return on the Yahi Trail along the creek but can decide on our route the day of the hike.

PLACE: Horseshoe Lake, Upper Bidwell Park. Coffee or cool drink after, place TBD (optional)

DATE: Tuesday, June 13, 2023 TIME 8:30 am (new time)

WEAR: Layers, hat, walking or hiking shoes or boots

LOGISTICS: Bring water. Bring a snack, if desired. Suggest bringing sunscreen, lip balm, walking poles or staff if desired, a personal first aid kit, and a hat. This is a bird area so binoculars could come in handy. Include in your pack the name of an emergency contact and contact information and medical insurance information. Bring money for gathering for a drink afterward (optional).

COMMENTS: This hike is generally on uneven terrain with some elevation changes. Surfaces are uneven so be alert to tripping and fall hazards. We need to be aware of other trail users that may include joggers and cyclists. Temperatures are starting to climb so the start time was moved earlier. Participants will need to stay hydrated and watch for signs of heat stress. No hikes are planned at the present time for July and August. We'll see how temperatures look for September.



50 Years Ago June 22, 1973: Mark Felt resigned as Deputy Director of the FBI, after taking the job the day after the death of Director J. Edgar Hoover on May 2, 1972. On May 3, 1972, Nixon appointed L. Patrick Gray – a Justice Department official with no FBI experience – as Acting Director of the FBI, with W. Mark Felt becoming Associate Director. During his time on the job, Felt secretly informed Washington *Post* reporter Bob Woodward about the details of the Watergate scandal investigation, and was identified by the *Post* only as "Deep Throat". He would not reveal the secret of who Deep Throat actually was until 2005.

Music Notes

"I Walk the Line" by Johnny Cash

"I Walk the Line" is a song written and recorded in 1956 by Johnny Cash. It became Cash's first #1 hit on the *Billboard* charts, and eventually reached #17 on the US pop charts. The song remained on the record charts for over 43 weeks, and sold over two million copies. It was the title song for a 1970 film starring Gregory Peck and Tuesday Weld and a 2005 biopic of Cash starring Joaquin Phoenix.

The song is included in "The 500 Songs That Shaped Rock and Roll", and is a permanent exhibit at the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. In 2004, Rolling Stone magazine ranked the song at No. 30 on its list of the 500 Greatest Songs of All Time, and also ranked it #1 on its list of the 100 greatest country songs of all time in June 2014.

One of the most defining country-western musicians ever, Cash created one of his biggest hits shortly after his marriage to Vivian Liberto, his first wife. He meant it as a declaration of fidelity since she was his first wife. The song's lyrics discuss resisting temptation, being accountable, and remaining faithful. However, Johnny Cash would eventually divorce Vivian Liberto and marry **June Carter**. Liberto wrote a book called *I Walked the Line* about her time with Cash.


