This is a bird area so binoculars could come in handy. Include in your pack the name of an emergency contact and contact information and medical insurance information. Bring money for gathering for a drink afterward (optional).

**COMMENTS:** This hike is generally on uneven terrain with some elevation changes. Surfaces are uneven so be alert to tripping and fall hazards. We need to be aware of other trail users that may include joggers and cyclists. Temperatures can be warm so make sure to bring water. Participants will need to stay hydrated and watch for signs of heat stress.



#### Changes to By Laws/Policies reviewed/accepted during 2025 Annual Meeting:

By Law change - Remove all references to retired from corporate documents. (Unanimously passed)

Policy Updates briefed to those in attendance. These are brief summaries; please refer to Manual for complete information. FYI the manual now has hyperlinks to take you from the Table of Contents to the direct policy you wish to review.

<u>Policy 9A - CASH RESERVE GUIDELINES</u>: As a guide Branch cash reserves should be budgeted at \$40.00 per member at year end. (100 member branches should budget about \$4,000 in cash reserves at year end). At any rate, cash reserves should be adequate to reimburse the luncheon's food provider without requiring the Treasurer to quickly deposit funds to cover the amount of the bill.

<u>Policy 11. PARTICIPATION – MEMBERS and GUESTS:</u> Only members of SIR, Inc. and their guests are entitled to participate in the activities of the organization. The number of guests shall not exceed the total number of participating SIR, Inc. members plus participating wives, companions and relatives of participating members, and widows of deceased members. A "relative" is defined as a spouse, parent, sibling, child, or grandchild and they are not guests when attending SIR activities or events.

Policy 12. MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA: Membership shall be open to any man regardless of age, race, color, or religion who will participate in SIR activities, events, luncheon meetings, and is also willing to volunteer and bring guests for the purpose of perpetuating the organization. Except as set forth below, a guest may attend a Branch's activities, luncheons or events a total of three times. For purposes of this policy, a member's relative as defined in Policy 11, is not a "guest" and can participate without limitation. The Big Sir may, in his discretion, either directly or through his activity chair, allow non-members to participate in SIR activities, events and luncheon meetings without the requirement that they become a member of SIR. Finally, branch members can participate in joint activities with other groups provided (i) the activity has been approved by the BEC prior to participation and (ii) it is suggested that the member wear some article of clothing identifying their membership in SIR.

<u>Policy 13. GUEST POLICY:</u> A guest (non-relative) may attend a Branch's activities, luncheons, or events a total of three times. Given unusual circumstances, the Big Sir may extend this attendance to a total of five occurances. The guest must then become a member to continue Branch participation.

<u>Policy 20a. CONFLICT OF INTEREST:</u> Federal compliance I-800 part of a check list of items to be done each year by the organization. The purpose of the conflict-of-interest policy is to protect SIR Inc., and chartered branches, when entering a transaction or arrangement that has a potential to result in excessive benefit to the private interest of an officer, director, committee chair or member of SIR Inc., or any of the chartered branches.

<u>Policy Appendix B-13 - RECORD RETENTION FOR SIR, INC. BRANCHES:</u> The Branch Secretaries shall retain records related to the local Branch. Those records shall be kept for a minimum period of five (5) years. The Branch Treasurers shall retain financial records for a period of seven (7) years.


<u>Policy Appendix B-14 – FIRST AID AND SAFETY:</u> Even though it is not required, each branch should make a conscious effort to provide first aid and safety to their members. The Branch should also consider having some of its members attend Red Cross training sessions in first aid and CPR. At luncheons they should confirm that, if possible, the venue providing lunch has appropriate first aid and rescue equipment available in case it is needed. If the venue cannot provide it, the Branch should consider providing it on their own.

<u>In Addition:</u> Training Sessions via Zoom are scheduled for Oct 24th and Nov 7th. Each of these sessions cover different items and are intended for President/VP, both current and incoming. Of course a focus is for those incoming (2026 officers). Detailed Zoom links will be sent to AR's, Branch Presidents and Vice Presidents closer to the dates. It is imperative that Form 20 be updated to ensure accurate distribution.
